CONNECT PDX CONFERENCE:

A highlight for the year was organizing and sponsoring a collaboration conference for fifty plus organizations, both secular and Christian, called Connect PDX. Reports are that attendees were reenergized in their own work and connected with others for collaborative work. The Multnomah County Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) executive committee added three more work groups as a direct result of the workshop's outcomes. Connect PDX was a critical advancement in our efforts to end human trafficking in the greater Portland area all to God's glory.

HIGHLIGHTS:

Regular weekly workshops for small groups of girls began at the Design Studio. A professional architect is leading the charge to complete the permitting process for the expansion of the donated Design Studio space.

Over **90** volunteer hours are being invested every week to raise awareness and funds for the prevention of sex trafficking and support for its victims. Thank you to over 2 dozen volunteers from over a dozen churches.

Over \$53,000 raised in Shop sales in 2012 and reinvested in ministries fighting against sexual exploitation.

48 girls living in foster homes and shelters, plus 21 caseworkers and foster parents, attended the Dress for FREEdom event and received hope in Christ through the testimony of a foster care "survivor". The girls took home free prom or banquet dresses and gift cards donated by a generous Compassion Connect family.

An increasing number of exploited women and girls are themselves volunteering at the Adorned in Grace Shop and Design Studio ministries. As they are ministered to, they in turn want to minister to others.
